REGISTRATION FORMS:

Are available on the Tennessee Science Olympiad web site at <http://tnscioly.utk.edu>. We encourage you to bookmark the web site and check it periodically for updates, official information, and resources such as a Coach's Information Manual and TSO Policies. Registration fees for the 2021 tournaments are \$150 for the first team from returning schools and \$75 for each additional team and \$75 per team for new schools or schools that have not competed in the last 3 years. Schools will be allowed to register teams until December 18. Teams that register after December 18 will be charged an additional \$50 late fee.

PRELIMINARY TOURNAMENT DATES

Tennessee will be using the Mini SO format for all preliminary (formerly regional) tournaments. We will offer 18 events over the last 3 Saturdays in February. Each Saturday, six events will be offered, three in an early time slot and three in a later time slot. All teams across the state will compete at the same time. All events, including the trial events (which will be counted as a regular event in determining advancement) are found in the Coach's Manual for this year. The manual can be downloaded for free from the Store on the national website, www.soinc.org. The schedule for each Saturday is shown below.

STATE TOURNAMENT:

The State Tournament may be virtual (April 10 or 17) or on-site (April 24) depending on COVID-19 conditions in the spring. If on site, it will be held at the University of Tennessee, Knoxville campus.

COACHES' WORKSHOPS:

It is our plan that all event coordinator groups will prepare a virtual presentation for their event which will highlight details of their event, resources that students will find helpful in preparing for the event, a list of any differences in the events at the preliminary and state levels and/or suggestions of specific topics that will be covered on preliminary or state exams. All registered teams will have these presentations available to them as they become available.

ELEMENTARY SCIENCE OLYMPIAD:

Elementary tournaments are an excellent way to begin preparing students early on for Science Olympiad. The Board has just begun discussing the possibility of offering some type of elementary competition this year. Check the state website for updates on elementary Science Olympiad.

INVITATIONAL TOURNAMENTS:

The national website lists invitational tournaments that you might want to consider. At this time, we are unsure whether we will host a virtual invitational tournament in Tennessee. Again, watch the state website for additional information as it becomes available.
